Parent Meeting: Return to In-Person Learning

A-B Rotations: What does that mean?

- Students assigned to A rotation attend school on Monday and Tuesday and are remote on Thursday and Friday.
- Students assigned to B rotation attend school on Thursday and Friday and are remote on Monday and Tuesday.
- All students will be remote on Wednesdays.

Before Arrival

- All parents complete the daily symptoms screener each morning by 7:20.
 - Can access link via school website (towards bottom on left hand side) or via QR code.
 - Need student ID number to complete. Students use ID to log on technology or the homeroom teachers can provide it for you.



Arrival Procedures: Bus

- Complete attestation to give to bus driver each week
 - We included two copies to get you started in the mailer (blue)
- Complete the **electronic screener** from slide 3 each day
- When students exit the bus, they will be reminded to practice social distancing - Staff will verify screener is complete and take temp
- If no screener has been completed, they will be isolated until we can contact parent to complete the daily screener over the phone

Arrival Procedures Car:

- Students will be screened from cars only. Please have students ready on the passenger side of the car with their masks on.
 - No walk-ups, no walkers, no early drop offs
 - Parents should not exit their cars during drop off
- Place their name tag (usually used for afternoon pickup) in the front window of your car.
- Students will have their temperature taken and screener completed before they can exit the car.
- Have your phone ready to show the green check mark to verify the screener has been successfully completed.

Safety Precautions

- While on campus and the school bus students are required to wear a face covering.
- Staff and students complete a health screening and temperature check daily.
- We have placed desks in classrooms 6 feet apart.
- Students will not share materials at school.
- We are restricting movement within the building.
- There will be a concentrated effort to disinfect throughout the day and between student rotations.

Safety Precautions

- We are practicing social distancing throughout the school. Hallways are clearly marked.
- Focus on teaching students proper methods to wash hands and frequent hand washing throughout the school day
- We have designated restrooms for each grade level.
- We ask that you limit items brought from home.
- We have a full time nurse on campus.
- Special area classes are held in the homeroom classrooms.
- For grades 1-5, teachers will move classrooms, but students will not.

Breakfast / Lunch

- After students are cleared to enter the building they will go straight to their homeroom class.
- Students who need breakfast will be escorted to the cafeteria from the homeroom class to pick up breakfast and return to the classroom to eat.
- Students who buy lunch will be escorted to the cafeteria to buy lunch and return to the classroom to eat.
- All students will eat in the classrooms.
- Students will also be able to have a snack, as usual. Homeroom teachers will send more info about this.

Daily Schedule

- All students:
 - Each day will begin with Homeroom, SEL, Read Aloud.
 - Students will have whole group lessons for Literacy and Math
- In Person Days:
 - Small group for Literacy and Math daily
 - Scheduled recess/lunch/brain breaks/non-screen time activities
 - Asynchronous work - independent work
 - Special area classes
- Remote Days:
 - Asynchronous work for all Literacy, Math, Science or SS, and Special area classes
 - No small groups

What to bring

- Fully charged technology device
- Power cord
- Masks
- Refillable water bottle - we are not using the water fountains in the traditional ways due to safety concerns
- Math and Literacy workbooks
- Individual baggie with supplies: pencils, erasers, crayons, colored pencils, etc... (teachers will send you more info on this)
- Snack

**Please do not send toys or items for recess such as balls or games.

Wednesdays: Remote for All

- All students will work remotely on Wednesdays.
- Each day will begin with Homeroom, SEL, Read Aloud.
- Students will have whole group class for Literacy and Math.
- Asynchronous work assigned.
- Very limited small groups may be held.

Attendance

- Students are expected to attend in-person learning on their assigned rotation day, unless they are not feeling well, have a doctor's appointment, or have been asked to be quarantined because of COVID - please call the school if your child is not feeling well or has one of these reasons to be at home, so we can excuse the absence
- Rotation A attends on Mondays and Tuesdays
- Rotation B attends on Thursdays and Fridays

Isolation room

- If a child is not feeling well while at school, they will be assessed by the school nurse.
- If a child begins to show any of the following symptoms during the school day, they will be sent to the isolation room: fever of 100.4 or greater, chills, shortness of breath, new cough, new loss of taste or smell.
- Child will be monitored away from others while waiting for a parent to pick them up.
- Socially distanced while in the room

Isolation room - When Can My Child Return to School?

Return to school policy:

- If student receives confirmation of an alternative diagnosis from a health care provider that would explain the COVID-19 like symptoms and have been fever-free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication.
- If the child receives a negative COVID-19 test, and there is no fever without the use of fever-reducing medication, and they have felt well for 24 hours - the child can return 24 hours after fever and symptoms resolved.

Isolation room - When Can My Child Return to School?

- If your child has tested positive for COVID-19 - please let us know. The student should not be in school and should stay home. We will give you more information about their return to school date when you let us know about the positive test.
- If a student has symptoms but does not receive a test or an alternative diagnosis, they can return 10 days after symptoms started, if at least 24 hours without a fever with no fever-reducing medication and all symptoms are improving.
- A letter will be provided to you with all of this information if your child has been in the isolation room.
