IV. Academic Business – Sheena Miracle, Principal

a) Enrollment 99%

b) Staffing Updates: In-school suspension, Exceptional Children, Title I tutor position to support students.

- Student Council Election taking place.
- Spirit Week in place with a PBIS event on Friday, October 1st. Kona Ice – tied with behavior expectations
- Clubs are scheduled to begin October 8, 2021 and proceed to Thanksgiving week. Clubs will resume February 1, and run until Spring Break.

c) Class Transitions: Supported transitions are continuing to be utilized during certain times of the day. This is to ensure that safety remains priority and that students arrive on time for their instruction. Eighth grade has flexibility more than sixth grade. Children make better decisions when adults are present. Incidents are occurring during line-up times – student poor choice during these times cause disruption.

e) Curriculum Night Update : Curriculum Night was well attended and positive feedback received from families. Grade level presentations to be uploaded. Continue to support understanding of differentiation from families. Teachers required to send updates to families. Event studies department, research, resource. Sixth grade ELA teachers on same concept with different leveled groups to prepare for socratic seminar. Intentionality of planning process. Turn & talk to practice before delivery by students.

- Survey utilized to answer a few remaining questions regarding class composition.
- Follow up supporting documents will be generated to support what is the difference between a curriculum supplement or replacement and an instructional strategy.

V. School Improvement Plan (SIP) – Catherine Eldridge, Academic Facilitator

School Improvement Plan due on 10/1/21, turn in 9/30/21.

a) New SMART Goals

1. By June 2022, Sedgefield students in grades 6-8 will meet the 65% GLP and a 50% CCR in reading in as measured by performance on EOGs.
 65% score from proficiency score valued over .5, can calculate that have to actually pass. Was applied to 7th & 8th graders.
 82 – 6th 45.8% 173 65% - 82 students to move about 30 kids into proficient. Current 7th graders. 552 proficiency reading score – some can be tutored in SEL time and some will move just by being present in class.
 Math 96-151 @ CCR level. Keep them high as they are the hardest to grow.
 Growth score & letter grade score when data is available. If we have 10 or more students within a subgroup, the data will give both growth score & letter grade. ELLs grew and used Title I dollars to fund the .5 teacher position for Ms. Ledbetter.
 Data will typically come out in September. Based on scale points not percentile.
 Data shows that if a student is proficient on January MAP test, then they will be proficient on the EOG test.

 Capture growth for all children – since no formal EOG/EOG, re-normed reading - is usually based year to year on EOG/EOC. (Reading as re-normed last year.) Can focus on specific groups.

 Want to find a way to target all children in building to find a growth measurement. Trying to get away from specific sub-groups.
 Fall map does give Spring map projection score.
2. By June, 2022, Sedgefield students in grades 6-8 will meet 60% GLP and a 50% CCR in math as measured by performance on EOGs.

Math 1 can change from 100%. Not to be held to perfection but to reflect growth. Ms. Eldridge will come up with reading and math goal 6-8 population.

3. By June, 2022, Sedgefield students in grades 6-8 will meet 65% GLP and a 50% CCR in science as measured by performance in EOC Science exam.
4. By June, 2022, Sedgefield students in grades 6-8 will meet 95% GLP and a 90% CCR in math 1 as measured by performance on EOGs.

b) Comprehensive Needs Assessment

c) NC Star Indicators:

A1.07 Attendance & behavior incentives to be separate. All teachers employ effective classroom management and reinforce classroom rules and procedures by positively teaching them. Communication for students to understand.

A2.04 Instructional teams develop standards aligned units instruction for each subject and grade level.

Resources on re-teaching, extending beyond “canned” curriculum. Add Vanderbilt units.

A4.06 School implements a tiered instructional system that allows teachers to deliver evidence based instruction aligned to the individual needs of students across all tiers. Remove teacher office hours. Revolves around MTSS to ensure success for students.

A4.16 The school develops and implements consistent intentional and on-going plans to support student transitions for grade to grade and level to level.

B 2.03 The school has established a team structure among teachers with specific duties and time for instructional planning. Student services meets weekly. AIG is not a specific person but carries for supporting the students. Part of the culture. Ms. Eldridge is AIG facilitator.

B 3.03 The principal monitors curriculum and classroom instruction regularly and timely, gives clear and constructive feedback to teachers. Accomplished all the tasks last year. PD & coaching needs. Principal and her designees – strong system in place that is tiered and strategically managed. Part of the culture.

C 2.01 The LEA/school regularly looks at school performance data and aggregated classroom observation data and uses the data to make decisions about school improvement and professional development needs. PD for AIG/EC/ELL students, add MAP data, indicators, setting goals. PLC meetings to talk about data. MTSS meetings could be case by case basis or as needed.

C3.04 The LEA/school has established a system of procedures and protocols for recruiting, evaluating, rewarding and replacing staff. Beginning teacher program, teacher of the month, teacher of the year to be added.

E1.06 The school regularly communicated with parents/guardians about it expectations of them and the importance of curriculum of the home (what parents can do at home to support their child’s learning). Moved forward from last year. Literacy and math night brought out to the learning community.

Rewrite by Ms. Eldridge to be done by Wednesday. It will be voted on through secret ballot by staff on Wednesday, 9/29,21. An email will be sent out to advise completed. Signing options – digital signing/virtual or hard signatures by Thursday, 9/30/21 @ 2 p.m. to turn into learning community.

**Goal to add: 75% of students in 6th-8th grade will meet or exceed projected growth from the beginning to end of year on MAP assessment in both reading and math.
